Introduction

This Winter Travel Map describes over-snow vehicle regulations and human closures on the Teton Division of the Bridger-Teton National Forest from December 1 - May 1 (6:00 am). For information regarding wheeled vehicle regulations, free Motor Vehicle Use Maps are available at any Ranger District Office or on the Forest website.

This map is intended to help the winter recreationist enjoy the Bridger-Teton National Forest safely while protecting natural resources. Additional closures or restrictions may be made at any time for resource protection or public safety. To avoid inconvenience, Forest Visitors are encouraged to contact local Ranger District Offices for current travel information.

Definition

OVER-SNOW VEHICLE - A self-propelled vehicle intended for travel primarily on snow, having a curb weight of not more than 1,000 pounds, driven by a track or tracks on contact with the snow, and steered by a ski or skis in contact with the snow.

Winter Travel Restrictions

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited within the area described in this Order, all within the Jackson and Blackrock Ranger Districts, Bridger-Teton National Forest as shown on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

1. Possessing or using an over-snow vehicle on a National Forest System Trail in violation of restrictions specified on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

2. Possessing or using an over-snow vehicle on a National Forest System Road in violation of restrictions specified on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A.
36 CFR 261.54 (a)
3. Possessing or using an over-snow vehicle off National Forest System Roads or Trails in violation of restrictions specified on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A.
36 CFR 261.56
4. Going into or being upon the area depicted on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A that is closed for the protection of wintering wildlife.

5. Using or possessing an over-snow vehicle in the area or on the roads or trails described in this Order and depicted on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A that weighs in excess of 1,000 pounds, or that is not steered by a ski or skis in contact with the ground. 36 CFR 261.55(b), 261.56

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (c) the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

AREA DESCRIBED:

All area within the administrative boundaries of the Jackson and Blackrock Ranger Districts, Bridger Teton National Forest, Teton, Park, Fremont, Lincoln, and Sublette Counties, Wyoming.

The area subject to this Order is depicted on the Map attached hereto as Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein by reference.

PURPOSE:

These restrictions are necessary to protect wintering wildlife habitat from the disturbance caused by over-snow vehicles and human uses, to protect natural resources (physical and biological) and separate motorized and non-motorized recreation uses to reduce potential for user conflicts.

DEFINITIONS:

Over-snow vehicle - A motor vehicle that is designed for use over snow and that runs on a track or tracks and/or a ski or skis, while in use over snow. 36 CFR 212.1

Motor vehicle - Any vehicle which is self-propelled, other than:

- (1) A vehicle operated on rails, and
- (2) Any wheelchair or mobility device, including one that is battery-powered, that is designed solely for use by a mobility-impaired person for locomotion, and that is suitable for use in and indoor pedestrian area.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect April 28, 2022 and shall remain in effect until June 1, 2024, or until rescinded, whichever occurs first.
2. Any violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals, and \$10,000.00 for organizations and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].
3. Order supersedes any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order.
