FOREST ORDER NO. 06-02-22-02

OCCUPANCY AND USE / CAMPING RESTRICTIONS

Pursuant to 16 USC § 551 and 36 CFR § 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited upon lands, roads, and trails administered by the Fremont-Winema National Forest as described in this order and shown in Exhibit A. This Order is effective beginning October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2024, unless rescinded earlier.

PROHIBITIONS:

- 1. Camping or otherwise occupying at any location (including leaving camping equipment and/or related supplies) for a period longer than 14 calendar days. [36 CFR§261.58(a)]
- 2. Camping, occupying, or otherwise leaving camping equipment and/or related supplies at any locations on the Fremont-Winema National Forest described in this order for more than 28 days total during a calendar year. [36 CFR 261.58(a)]

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this order.
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 3. Those persons camping in specific designated campgrounds and in those camping spaces or locations under permit or special use authorization approved by the Administrative Unit for extended stay in excess of this order.
- 4. Klamath Tribal members may set up camp on National Forest lands located within the boundaries of the former Klamath Indian reservation, and in those areas traditionally used by Tribal members, except the Klamath Tribes will ensure that Tribal member campsites shall not be established where they would interfere with an active Forest Service timber sale. Tribal Identification cards shall serve as the permit for such camping.

DEFINITIONS:

For the purpose of this order, and pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.2, the following definitions apply to this order.

- 'Camping' means the temporary use of National Forest Service System lands for the purpose of overnight occupancy without a permanently fixed structure.
- 'Camping Equipment' means the personal property used in or suitable for camping, and includes any vehicle used for transportation and all equipment in possession of a person camping. Food and beverage are not considered camping equipment.
- 'Special-use authorization' means a permit, term permit, lease or easement which allows occupancy, or use rights or privileges of National Forest System land.
- 'Administrative Unit' means a National Forest, a purchase unit, a land utilization project, or other comparable unit of the National Forest System.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC § 551; 18 USC § 3551, 3559, 3571, and 3581)
