Order No. 04-96-2 WILDERNESS USE RESTRICTIONS

JOHN MUIR, ANSEL ADAMS, GOLDEN TROUT, HOOVER, BOUNDARY PEAK, INYO MOUNTAINS AND SOUTH SIERRA WILDERNESSES

INYO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited in the John Muir, Ansel Adams, Golden Trout, Hoover, Boundary Peak, Inyo Mountains and South Sierra Wilderness Areas within the Inyo National Forest, until further notice:

- 1. Within the areas noted below, building, maintaining, attending, or using any fire, campfire, or stove fire, except portable stoves using gas, jellied petroleum, or liquid fuel. 36 C.F.R. 261.52(a):
 - a. North Fork of Lone Pine Creek, Lone Pine Creek, and the Meysan Lake drainage as shown on "Exhibit A" dated 4/93.
 - b. Golden Trout Lakes drainage northwest of Onion Valley, the Kearsarge Pass Trail area, and the area around Robinson Lake, all as shown on "Exhibit B" dated 4/93.
 - c. 20 Lakes Basin area northwest of Saddlebag Lake as shown on "Exhibit C" dated 4/93.
 - d. North Fork of Big Pine Creek as shown on "Exhibit D" dated 4/93.
 - e. Bishop Creek drainage: South Fork those areas shown on "Exhibit D" dated 4/93; Sabrina Basin and North Fork those areas as shown on "Exhibit E" dated 4/93; Tyee Lakes those areas as shown on "Exhibit M" dated 4/93.
 - f. Rock Creek drainage (also called Little Lakes Valley) as shown on "Exhibit F" dated 4/93.
 - g. Within the McGee Creek drainage as shown on "Exhibit N" dated 4/93.
 - h. Within 1/4 mile of the outlets of Garnet and Thousand Island Lakes as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
 - i. Within 300 feet of the shore of Shadow Lake, and between Shadow Creek Trail and Shadow Creek from Shadow Lake to Ediza Lake outlet crossing, as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
 - j. Within the Lake Ediza watershed as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
 - k. Within the Minaret Lake watershed as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.

- Duck Lake watershed and within 300 feet of the following: the Duck Lake outlet, the Purple Lake outlet, and the shore of Barney Lake, all as shown on "Exhibit H" dated 4/93.
- m. Cottonwood Lakes Basin, including South Fork and Cir que Lakes, as shown on "Exhibit I" dated 4/93.
- n. Chicken Spring Lake watershed as shown on "Exhibit I" dated 4/93.
- o. Rocky Basin Lakes watershed as shown on "Exhibit J" dated 4/93.
- p. Anvil Camp area: within 1000 feet of the junction of Shepherd Creek and Forest Development Trail 34E02, the Sheperd Pass Trail as shown on "Exhibit K" dated 4/93.
- q. South Fork of Big Pine Creek and watershed as shown in "Exhibit P" dated 6/94.
- 2. Shortcutting a switchback on any Forest Development Trail. 36 C.F.R. 261.55(♠)♠
- Hitching, tethering or tying pack or saddle stock within 100 feet of lakes, streams, trails, and campsites except while loading and unloading. 36 C.F.R. 261.58(aa)
- 4. Leaving any debris, garbage or refuse within the wilderness unless consumed by an authorized fire. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(g)
- 5. Washing and/or discharging soap wastes within 100 feet of lakes and streams. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(g)
- 6. Depositing bodily wastes within 100 feet of lakes, streams, campsites or trails. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(g)
- 7. Camping for longer than 14 consecutive days in any Travel Zone (Zones as identified in Area Management Plans). 36 C.F.R. 261.58(a)
- 8. Where terrain permits, having any portion of a campsite closer than 100 feet from lakeshores, streams, and Forest Development Trails, but in no case will a campsite be closer than 25 feet from said lakeshores, streams and trails. 36 C.F.R. 261.58(e)
- 9. Camping in the following areas: 36 C.F.R. 261.58(e)
 - a. Mirror Lake for a distance of 500 feet from the shoreline in all directions, the timbered areas east of Mirror Lake and south of Lone Pine Creek as signed on the ground, and the small trailside meadow approximately 1/2 mile above Mirror Lake as signed on the ground, all as shown on "Exhibit A" dated 4/93.

- b. Within a 1/4 mile of the outlets of Thousand Island and Garnet Lakes as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
- c. The south side of Ediza Lake as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
- d. Within 300 feet of the shoreline of Shadow Lake as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
- e. Between Shadow Creek Trail and Shadow Creek from Shadow Lake to Ediza Lake outlet crossing as shown on "Exhibit G" dated 4/93.
- f. Within 300 feet of the outlets of Purple Lake and Duck Lake as shown on "Exhibit H" dated 4/93.
- g. Within 1/4 mile of any water spring within the Inyo Mountains Wilderness Area as shown on "Exhibit Q" dated 3/96.
- 10. Camping with pack or saddle stock between Shepherd Pass Trailhead and Shepherd Pass as shown on "Exhibit L" dated 4/93. 36 C.F.R. 261.57.(a)
- 11. Possessing pack or saddle stock in the area between Trail Crest and Whitney Portal as shown on "Exhibit A" dated 4/93. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(a)
- 12. Discharging a firearm, air rifle, or gas gun except for emergencies and the taking of wildlife as permitted by state game laws. 36 C.F.R. 261.58(m)
- 13. Entering or using the wilderness with more than 25 head of pack or saddle stock. 36 C.F.R. 261.53(f)
- 14. Possessing or using any wheeled mechanical device, including but not limited to bicycles, wagons, or carts, but excluding wheelchairs being used by a disabled person. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(h)
- 15. Using a saddle, pack, or draft animal on any trail by loose herding or driving, except on portions of trails where it is unsafe to keep the animals tied together. 36 C.F.R. 261.55(c)
- 16. Grazing of pack or saddle stock between the Shepherd Pass Trailhead and Shepherd Pass as shown on "Exhibit L" dated 4/93 and Cascade Valley as shown on "Exhibit O" dated 4/93. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(e)
- 17. Entering or using a trail, campsite or other area by a group larger than 15 persons. 36 C.F.R. 261.58(f)
- 18. Storing or leaving unattended, equipment, personal property or supplies for more than 24 hours. 36 C.F.R. 261.57(f)


Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. 261.50(e), each of the following persons is exempt from this order:


- Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in performance of an official duty.




(Onion Valley Drainage)

- Area in which only portable stove using gas, jellified petroleum or liquid fuel is allowed. All other fires prohibited.







