



Hedge Creek Falls

Take I-5 to Exit 732 in Dunsmuir head west to Mott Road, turn right, the Hedge Creek Falls parking lot is on your immediate right. Walk ~0.1 miles up Mott Road, the falls trailhead will be on your left.

Brandy Creek Falls

Located in Whiskeytown NRA, take Hwy 299 West from Redding for ~10 miles, turn left at the Whiskeytown Visitor Center, and travel ~4.6 miles on JFK Memorial Hwy to the entrance of Brandy Creek Beach day use, turn left onto Brandy Creek Road past the junction for Sheep Camp, to the trailhead ~4 miles. Trailhead is on the left side of the road. The hike is ~1.6 miles one way with a 200' elevation gain. Call 530-246-1225 for current conditions. Fees apply



Crystal Creek Falls

Located in Whiskeytown NRA, take Hwy 299 West from Redding for ~17.4 miles to the west end of Whiskeytown Lake turn left on Crystal Creek Rd. Drive ~2.1 miles, turn left into the parking lot. Walk the road past the gate ~0.3 mile to the waterfall.

Whiskeytown Falls

Is the area's "newest" waterfall, recently rediscovered by Wildlife Biologist/Park Ranger Russ, and is the tallest waterfall in Shasta County. The park offers guided ranger hikes to the falls. Located inside Whiskeytown NRA this 220' cascading waterfall is worth the strenuous 1.7 miles hike into a box canyon surrounded by towering old growth forests. For a tour call the Whiskeytown Visitor Center at 530-246-1225

Sweetbriar Falls

Travel north on I-5 about one hour. Take the Sweetbriar Exit 723. Take Sweetbriar Road on the east side of I5 to Falls Ave, park in the lot to the left. Walk down Falls Ave and across the bridge over the Sacramento River, the falls are just a short distance to the right. The falls is best photographed late morning.

Pit River Falls

From the junction of Hwy 299/89 east of Burney, continue ~9.6 miles east on Hwy 299 to the Pit River Falls and Canyon Vista Point on the right side of the road. To hike to the falls continue about 0.2 miles on the highway to a dirt road on the right. You are ~1/2 mile from the waterfall. To experience the waterfall you'll need to scramble down the steep canyon to the waterfall's base, use at your own risk.

Hatchet Creek Falls

From I-5 take Hwy 299 East approximately 33 miles to Big Bend Road, turn left and park by the bridge. Hatchet Creek Falls is almost visible from the road, but a short hike up the creek provides and even greater view. The falls is best photographed mid-day. **(Note: The falls is on private property and may be closed to the public, use at your own risk)**



McCloud Falls

Upper, Middle and Lower Falls. From Redding, CA, travel north on I-5 about one hour to Hwy 89/ McCloud exit. You can see the Upper, Middle and Lower falls. The unpaved route for the three falls begins at Fowler's Campground, about 5 miles east of McCloud (road is impassable in inclement weather). The falls is best photographed is mid-day.

Burney Falls

Located in McArthur Burney Falls State Park. The 129 foot waterfall can be reached by traveling east on Hwy 299 to the Hwy 89 intersection, turn left on Hwy 89 travel approximately six miles to the park on your left. This beautiful falls was called the Eighth Wonder of the World by President Theodore Roosevelt. The falls is best photographed in the early morning hours .

Potem Falls

From I-5, take Hwy 299 East approximately 28 miles to Fenders Ferry Road. Turn left and proceed north about 18 miles. The falls can also be reached by boat via the Pit River arm of Shasta Lake, Potem Falls is about 45 feet high. The falls is best photographed in the very early morning, April through June.

Mill Creek Falls

Located inside Lassen Volcanic National Park, this is the Park's highest waterfall at 75 feet. Take Hwy 36 east from Red Bluff, turn left on Hwy 89, head north and enter the park at the southwest entrance. Turn right into the parking lot and use the east lot and proceed to the north end to the Mill Creek Falls trailhead. The trail is ~4 1/2 miles long and will take approximately 2 1/2 hours round trip, there is a descent of ~300 feet.

Kings Creek Falls

The falls is located inside Lassen Volcanic National Park and is ~70 feet high. Take Hwy 36 east from Red Bluff, turn left on Hwy 89, head north and enter the park at the southwest entrance. Travel ~12 miles look for Road Marker 32 the trailhead starts there. The round trip distance from the marker is approximately ~3 miles, you should allow ~2 1/2 hours for the hike, there is an ~500' elevation gain. The falls is best photographed from late July to early October in the early morning. Note: the park is closed during the winter months.
