

Administrative Change Helena – Lewis and Clark National Forest 2021 Land Management Plan

The Helena – Lewis and Clark National Forest is in central Montana and includes approximately 2,883,227 acres in portions of the following counties: Broadwater, Cascade, Chouteau, Fergus, Gallatin, Glacier, Golden Valley, Jefferson, Judith Basin, Lewis and Clark, Meagher, Park, Pondera, Powell, Sweet Grass, Teton, and Wheatland.

Overview

The Helena-Lewis and Clark National Forest is making an administrative change to correct mapping errors that were discovered after the publishing of the 2021 Land Management Plan. In addition, other Geographic Area maps needed to be updated to include designations for lands have been acquired since the plan was published. These changes are minor in the context of the 2.8+ million-acre forest and do not alter conclusions made in the programmatic EIS supporting the land management plan. The administrative change is summarized below, and the maps follow (map numbers correspond with the maps they replace in Appendix A of the 2021 Land Management Plan). This change will be effective as of September 8, 2022.

Changes by Geographic Area

Big Belts Geographic Area

- 108 acres were added to National Forest System lands
- These acres were mapped as follows:
 - Map BB-1: General ownership (shows the location of the added acres). There is one road (#4136-A1, Kingsberry Loop) that crosses this parcel, but already a NFSR (System route) that is open yearlong (MVUM=Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles Only, Yearlong).
 - Map BB-4: ROS: Roaded Natural 8 acres (7.9), Rural 100 acres (100.2)
 - Map BB-5: ROS-W: Semi-Primitive Non-Motorized 8 acres (7.9), Rural 100 acres (100.2)
 - Map BB-6: SIO: Low 56 acres (56.2), Moderate 52 acres (51.8)
 - Map BB-8: Designated Areas and ROS
 - Map BB-9: Designated Areas and Winter ROS
 - Map BB-12: Timber Suitability (Production): 45 acres (45.3) and Harvest Could Occur on Unsuitable Lands: 63 Acres (62.7)

Divide Geographic Area

- 17 acres were added to National Forest System lands
- These acres were mapped as follows:
 - Map D-1: General ownership (shows location of the added acres)
 - Map D-4: ROS and Map D-5: ROSW all 17 acres mapped as Semi-Primitive Non-Motorized
 - \circ Map D-6: SIO all 17 acres mapped as High SIO
 - Maps D-7, 8, and 9 Designated Areas all 17 acres added to South Hills Recreation Emphasis Areas
 - Map D-12: Timber all 17 acres mapped as Harvest Could Occur on Unsuitable Lands

Elkhorns Geographic Area

- Range allotments: the allotments on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF portion of the Elkhorns were inadvertently left off of the map, so were added (Map E-11).
- 142 acres were added to National Forest System lands (780 acres HLC NF, 640 acres B-D NF). The acres were mapped as follows:
 - Map E-1: General ownership
 - Map E-4: ROS all acres to Roaded Natural
 - Map E-5: ROSW 760 acres to Semi-Primitive Non-Motorized, 660 acres to Roaded Natural
 - Map E-6: SIO all acres to Low
 - Maps E-7, 8 and 9: Designated Areas all acres to Elkhorn Wildlife Management Unit
 - Map E-12: Timber all acres to Harvest Could Occur on Unsuitable Lands

Little Belts Geographic Area

• There are 1043 acres of privately owned lands within the Middle Fork Judith Wilderness Study Act Area. These areas are not subject to this Act or 2021 Land Management Plan direction (shown on existing map, note just added for clarification).

Rocky Mountain Geographic Area

• Maps RM-04, 05, 08, and 09: 55 acres were incorrectly mapped as Semi Primitive Non-Motorized ROS, when in fact they are in a Rural setting.

Snowies Geographic Area

• Maps S-7, 8 and 9: 131 acres of the Big Snowies Wilderness Study Act Area is on private land. These maps were updated to indicate this area is not subject to direction in this Act or the 2021 Land Management Plan.
