PROHIBITIONS IN AREAS DESIGNATED BY EMERGENCY ORDER

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. 261.50 (a) and (b), the following act is prohibited in the Dillon Ranger District, White River National Forest, Summit County, State of Colorado (the “Restricted Area”). The Restricted Area is depicted on the attached maps, hereby incorporated in the Order as Exhibit A, and is located in Sections 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, 22, and 23. Township 5 South, Range 77 West, and Section 18, Township 5 South, and Range 76 West. The Restricted Area includes all roads and trails within the Tenderfoot Mountain Road and Trail system and from Forest Road 66 (Frey Gulch Road) south to the White River National Forest boundary.

The purpose of this Order is to protect natural resources and provide for public safety.

PROHIBITIONS IN THE RESTRICTED AREA:

1. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire except in campgrounds and dispersed campsites that are designated and provided by the Forest Service 36 C.F.R. § 261.52 (a)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50 (a) , the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force engaged in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act of omission.

This Order will be in effect from April 18, 2023, and shall remain in effect until rescinded or until April 18, 2027, whichever event occurs first. This Order may be rescinded during the fall hunting season depending on conditions.

Violations of these regulations is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual of \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. § § 3571 and 3559
