Superior National Forest Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness Collaborative Member Selection Guidelines December 2023

Overview

The National Center for Environmental Conflict Resolution (National Center) is leading the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness (BWCAW) Collaborative membership selection process in consultation with a steering committee from the Superior National Forest (SNF) of the U.S. Forest Service. The SNF Steering Committee is providing input on member selection criteria, the overall process, and the timeline for convening the collaborative group. The National Center is serving as an impartial party to ensure a diversity of interests are represented and that selected members best meet membership criteria and qualifications. The plan is to have initial terms staggered, with some members committing to serve 2-year terms and others volunteering to serve 3-year terms. This will ensure some continuity of membership after the initial two years of the Collaborative. Upon selection, an invitation letter will be sent to the potential members. Shortly thereafter, the National Center facilitation team will schedule an initial meeting to kick off the collaborative effort.

Membership Criteria and General Qualifications

The following criteria and qualifications will be used for selecting members:

- Be able to commit the time and resources necessary to participate fully in the BWCAW Collaborative.
- Commit to respectful behavior and dialogue with others, including others who may have divergent viewpoints.
- Demonstrate a curiosity for learning and commitment to sharing perspectives and ideas that address multiple interests and concerns.
- Demonstrate an established communication network with others within area of interest or is committed to communicating about the collaborative and work of the SNF to a broader audience, including seeking input from others outside of the collaborative when needed.
- Demonstrate knowledge of, experience in, or expertise within a distinct interest area related to the BWCAW (see draft membership categories).

In addition to the above criteria, a diversity of perspectives and experiences within the following membership categories will be sought. We are currently seeking two seats (members) for each larger Area of Interest, for a total of approximately 25 members. The size and representative interests of the collaborative may evolve over time with input from the initial members.

Academia, Research, or Historical	Representatives of the academic, scientific, research, or historical aspects of the BWCAW
Recreationalists	Representative interests of outdoor users
Native Nations Representatives	Representative interest of Boise Forte, Fond du Lac, and Grand Portage Bands

Historically Underserved and Underrepresented Populations	Individual or group advancing equity for populations or communities that have been systematically denied aspects of economic, social, civic, and environmental services and benefits
Education and Interpretation (Youth and Adult)	Representative interests of those providing education and interpretative services to youth and/or adults
County Government or County-level Interest	Representative of county-level geographic coverage (with relevant interest in the BWCAW
Community level Interest (within gateway communities)	Representative of gateway community-level geographic coverage (with relevant interest)
