

SAN BERNARDINO NATIONAL FOREST Forest Order No. 05-12-52-24-02 Radford Fire Closure Area

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) & (b), and to provide for public safety and protect natural resources, the following acts are prohibited within the San Bernardino National Forest. This Order is effective from **February 7, 2024**, through **December 31, 2024**.

- 1. Entering or being in the Radford Fire Closure Area, as shown on Exhibit A and described in Exhibit B. **36 C.F.R. § 261.52(e).**
- 2. Being on any National Forest System roads within the Radford Fire Closure Area, as shown on Exhibit A and listed below:

Forest System Road 2N06 (Radford Truck Trail), 2N10 (Mill Creek), 2N10D (Snow Summit), and 2N21 (Sugarlump). **36 C.F.R. § 261.54 (e).**

3. Being on any National Forest System trails within the Radford Fire Closure Area, as shown on Exhibit A and listed below:

Forest Trail 1E12 (Skyline Trail), 1E29 (Pirates), and 1E30 (Fall Line). 36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
- 2. Any federal, state, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire-fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 3. Any Forest Service volunteer with a valid Volunteer Service Agreement (OF301a or OF301b) performing an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. § 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571 and 3581.
