- What are some key considerations/priorities related to visitor information and interpretation that should be addressed in the next 12-18 months?

- Appendix G Considerations:
 - Collaborative Management: Meet with managing agencies and partner organizations to discuss capacity and funding needs related to PNT management and implementation of this comprehensive plan, and to identify opportunities to strategically align and leverage resources.
 - Visitor Use Management: Coordinate with the National Park Service and the other managing agencies and partner organizations regarding trail management and administration.

Questions to Address:

- Looking at localized geographic areas, are there potential collaborators/stakeholders/interested parties along the trail that the Forest Service should be coordinating trail management with?
- What are the highest priority coordination needs that aren't already happening?
- What facilities/infrastructure are needed to better meet the nature and purposes for which the trail was designated? What areas/needs should be the highest priority and why?
