The Wayne National Forest has proposed a Closure Order (WNF-14-01-2015) to protect the underground mines, tunnels, and historic iron furnaces located within the Forest.

The proposed closure order is needed to provide for the public health and safety of the visiting public because of the potential for collapse, entrapment, and carbon monoxide poisoning within the underground mines and tunnels. Closing historic iron furnaces to the public allows for the preservation of irreplaceable historic sites. Prohibiting public entry to these areas also has the added benefit of potentially reducing the spread of White-Nose Syndrome among bats.

The proposed order and supporting documentation is attached. I recommend approval and implementation of the proposed order. Please advise if you have questions or require additional information to complete your review.



Attached is a proposed closure order (WNF-14-01-2015) for the Wayne National Forest and supporting documentation as required by Forest Service Handbook 5309.11, chapter 30 and the Order checklist.

The proposed prohibitions as described in the order are needed for the health and safety of the public who visit the WNF, employees of the U.S. Forest Service who work managing the Forest resources, and the protection of underground mines, tunnels, and historic iron furnaces located within the Wayne National Forest.

Wayne National Forest ORDER OF FOREST SUPERVISOR ORDER NUMBER WNF-14-01-2015

Under the authority of the Act of Congress dated June 4, 1897, as amended (16 U.S.C. 551), and pursuant to the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations set forth as 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart B (36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b)), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on the Wayne National Forest located within the State of Ohio. Specific site locations are privileged information. See Exhibit A. Attached map Exhibit B, is attached and made a part hereto:

- 1. Entering any underground mine on National Forest System lands within the Wayne National Forest, unless posted open 36 CFR 261.53(e)
- 2. Entering any tunnel on the Wayne National Forest 36 CFR 261.53(e)
- 3. Entering, climbing, or otherwise disturbing a historic iron furnace located within the Wayne National Forest 36 CFR 261.53(e)

THESE RESTRICTIONS ARE NECESSARY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND TO PROTECT NATIONAL FOREST PROPERTY/RESOURCES. THEY ARE IN ADDITION TO THE GENERAL PROHIBITIONS SET FORTH IN 36 CFR PART 261. THE PROHIBITION WILL BE IN EFFECT FROM THE DATE OF THIS ORDER UNTIL SPECIFICALLY WITHDRAWN BY TERMINATION ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR.

Pursuant to the provisions of 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission (36 CFR 261.50(e)(1)); and,
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty (36 CFR 261.50(e)(4).

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.


Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both (16 U.S.C., 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).





Civil Rights Impact Analysis (CRIA)

It is my determination that there will be no potential for major civil rights or social impacts related to the Wayne National Forest Prohibitions (36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b)) Order number WNF-14-01-2015, and therefore, a CRIA and Civil Rights Impact Statement (CRIS) are not required. Although the proposed action appears as if it would affect ten (10) or more persons or entities either inside or outside the Forest Service, I feel the CRIA and CRIS are not needed because the project decision is for an administrative action that is not listed as one of the six specific categories for which the preparation of a civil rights impact statement is required (see Forest Service Manual 1730 and Forest Service Handbook 1709.11, section 31.1).

Statement of Purpose and Need

Supervisor's Closure Order WNF-14-01-2015

The Wayne National Forest is proposing to implement Closure Order # WNF-14-01-2015 to close underground mines, tunnels, and historic iron furnaces to persons visiting the Wayne National Forest in an effort to protect the health and safety of the visiting public from possible mine or tunnel collapse, entrapment, and/or carbon monoxide poisoning within the aforementioned structures. The closing also has the added benefit of potentially slowing the spread of White-Nosed Syndrome among bats.

Closing historic iron furnaces to the public increases the potential for preservation of these irreplaceable historic sites and reduces the potential for acts of vandalism or other destructive activities.

The Proposed Order would add the following prohibited acts:

- Entering any underground mine or tunnel on National Forest System Lands within the Wayne National Forest (unless posted open) 36 CFR 261.53(e)
- Entering any historic tunnel located within the Wayne National Forest 36 CFR 261.53(e)
- Entering or climbing on any historic iron furnace 36 CFR 261.53(e)

Implementation and Enforcement Plan

Supervisor's Closure Order WNF-14-01-2015

Public Notice:

- Copies of the approved closure order shall be made available to the public at the Wayne National Forest Headquarters (Forest Supervisor's Office), and the Athens, Marietta, and Pedro Ranger Stations.
- Contents of the approved closure order shall be posted on the Wayne National Forest website at http://www.fs.fed.us/r9/wayne
- A news release describing the prohibited acts of the order shall be published in local newspapers.
- Signs shall be posted at those locations identified by field personnel as being areas likely to be used by the public in violation of the closure order.

Enforcement:

- Enforcement of the closure order shall be limited to Law Enforcement personnel and Forest Protection Officers who hold an up-to-date certification.
- Regular patrols of the areas closed by the order shall be conducted by law enforcement personnel.
- Officers and Forest Protection Officers shall exercise appropriate discretion when issuing warnings or violation notices.
- All violations of the order shall be documented using the appropriate law enforcement forms (5300-1 incident report) or (5300-4-violation notice).
