### AmeriCorps Get Sites in Shape





AmeriCorps volunteers clear downed trees resulting from the pine beetle epidemic and put in a new fire ring.

AmeriCorps St. Louis spent several weeks on the Forest completing numerous tasks including logging out and maintaining several trails, replacing new fire rings, painting and repairing tables, constructing fences and restocking firewood at cabins. Other projects included painting kiosks and removing dense young saplings that were choking the edges of a parking lot, and restoring the view of the East Pioneer Mountains.

#### **Recreation Fee Dollars**

Recreation fee dollars are an investment in outdoor recreation. They support and enhance:

- Recreation site maintenance and improvements
- Educational experiences
- Informational wayside exhibits
- Youth programs and partnerships
- Interpretive programs

Current and future generations will benefit as 80-95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

#### Scouts Build Fence and Wall

At the Sheepshead Recreation Area Eagle Scout candidates completed reconstruction of a rail fence and construction of a 100-foot retaining wall around a section of Maney Lake. The project included repairs to picnic tables, and reestablishing horseshoe pits.
