

Recreation Fee Program Accomplishment Highlights 2014 Prescott National Forest

Groom Creek Schoolhouse

The Prescott National Forest and Yavapai County Education Service Agency partnered to host three 10-person Youth Conservation Corps crews in 2014. At Groom Creek Schoolhouse, crews replaced an old bulletin board with a new Smokey Bear fire danger rating sign and relocated an existing interpretive sign. They also replaced a split rail fence; installed new steps; spread 10 tons of landscape rock; and sanded and painted 14 benches at the amphitheater. At Ranch Trailhead, a crew corrected an erosion issue, and at Sevenmile Gulch Trailhead, a crew replaced 15 new rails and 35 posts on a treated pole fence around the parking area.

Developed Recreation

- Spread gravel to improve access road and parking lot facility at Playground Group Campground.

- Through an agreement with Yavapai County Probations, probation crews assisted with clean up, brushing, and weed removal at multiple fee sites.

Additional Accomplishments

- Repaired roof leak and interior damage, replaced insulation and drywall, and repainted foyer at Horsethief Cabin.
- Cleaned, sealed cracks, patched, seal coated, and re-striped parking areas at two high-use day use sites.
- Cleaned out and constructed new ditches, and leveled and compacted gravel around host site at Alto Pit Off-Highway Vehicle Day Use Area and Campground. Improved access and provided dust abatement by grading, spreading asphalt millings, and compacting 150 feet of entrance road.
