# Campgrounds Modoc National Forest

### **General Information**

The Modoc National Forest offers a chance to get away and camp without crowds, traffic, and noise. Due to its remote location and smaller campgrounds the Forest is not a destination for people who are drawn to big name areas such as the Trinity Alps, Yosemite, the High Sierras, or Yellowstone.

wide You can choose from a variety campgrounds. All developed areas have stoves or grills, tables, vault toilets and many areas have piped water for drinking. Some campgrounds have both tent and trailer spaces and the more developed campgrounds charge a user fee. Because of the type and conditions of roads to campgrounds, there are limits in size of recreational vehicles for some of the camping and picnic areas. Please check the reverse side from more specific information on this and other activities or call one of our Forest Service offices listed here.

Most campsites are first come first served. Only a few campsites can be found at recreation.gov

**Pets** are allowed in the recreational areas unless otherwise posted. They MUST be on a leash when in a developed campground or picnic area

**Dispersed Recreation:** Not everyone wants to camp or recreate with crowds. There are dozens of campgrounds located outside of the designated campgrounds that offer a little more seclusion and a lot less noise. Of particular interest to forest visitors are areas along Ash Creek east of Adin, CA, and areas along Forest Roads 5 and 64 in the Warner Mountains.

**Campfires** - Campfire permits are required if have outside you intend to a fire developed campground or picnic area. The permits may be obtained free of charge from the nearest Forest Service office and from most Forest Service employees in the field. Wood for your campfire is free as long as you gather the dead and down wood. Use extra care with fire and make sure it is "DEAD OUT" when you leave.
