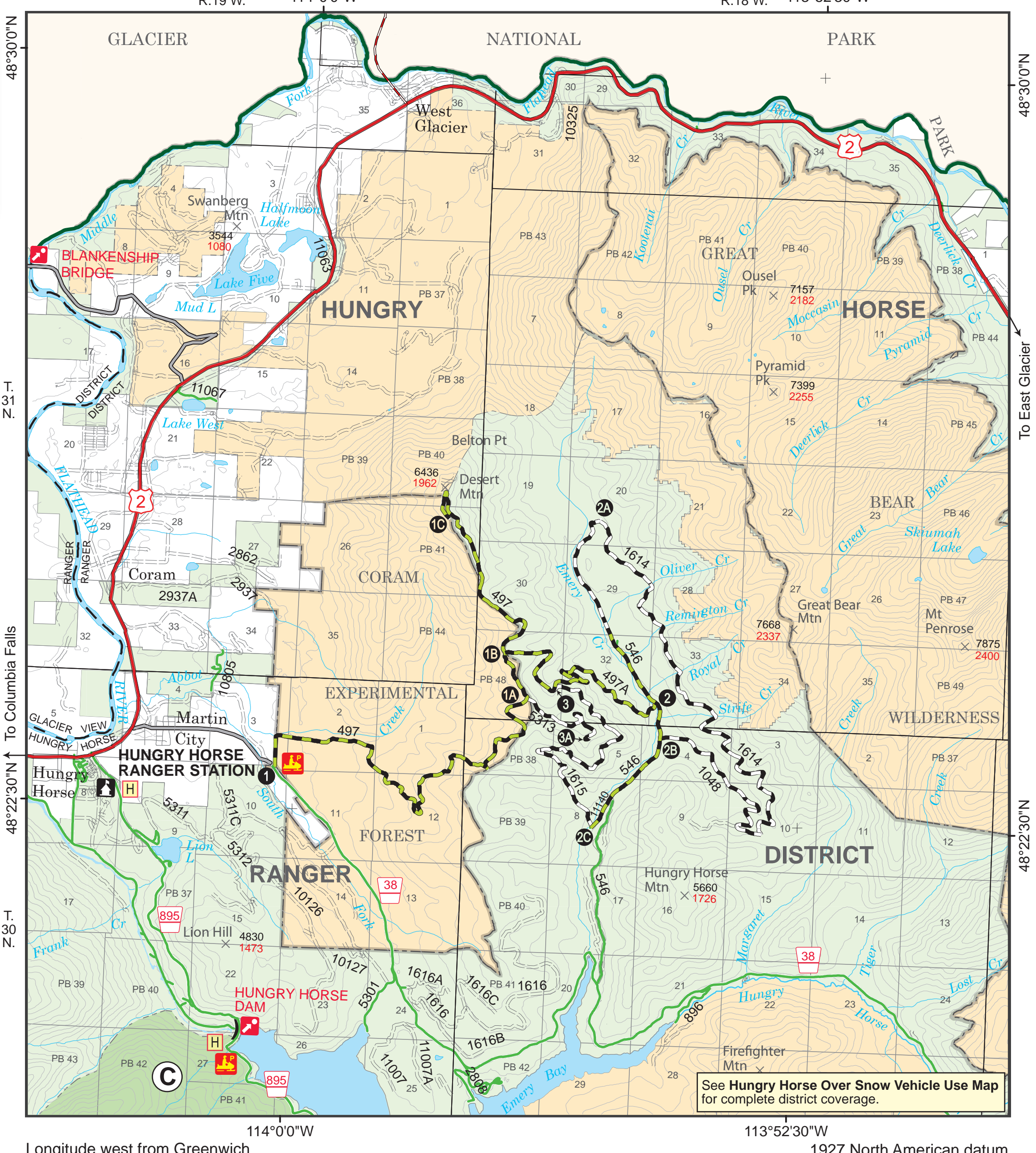
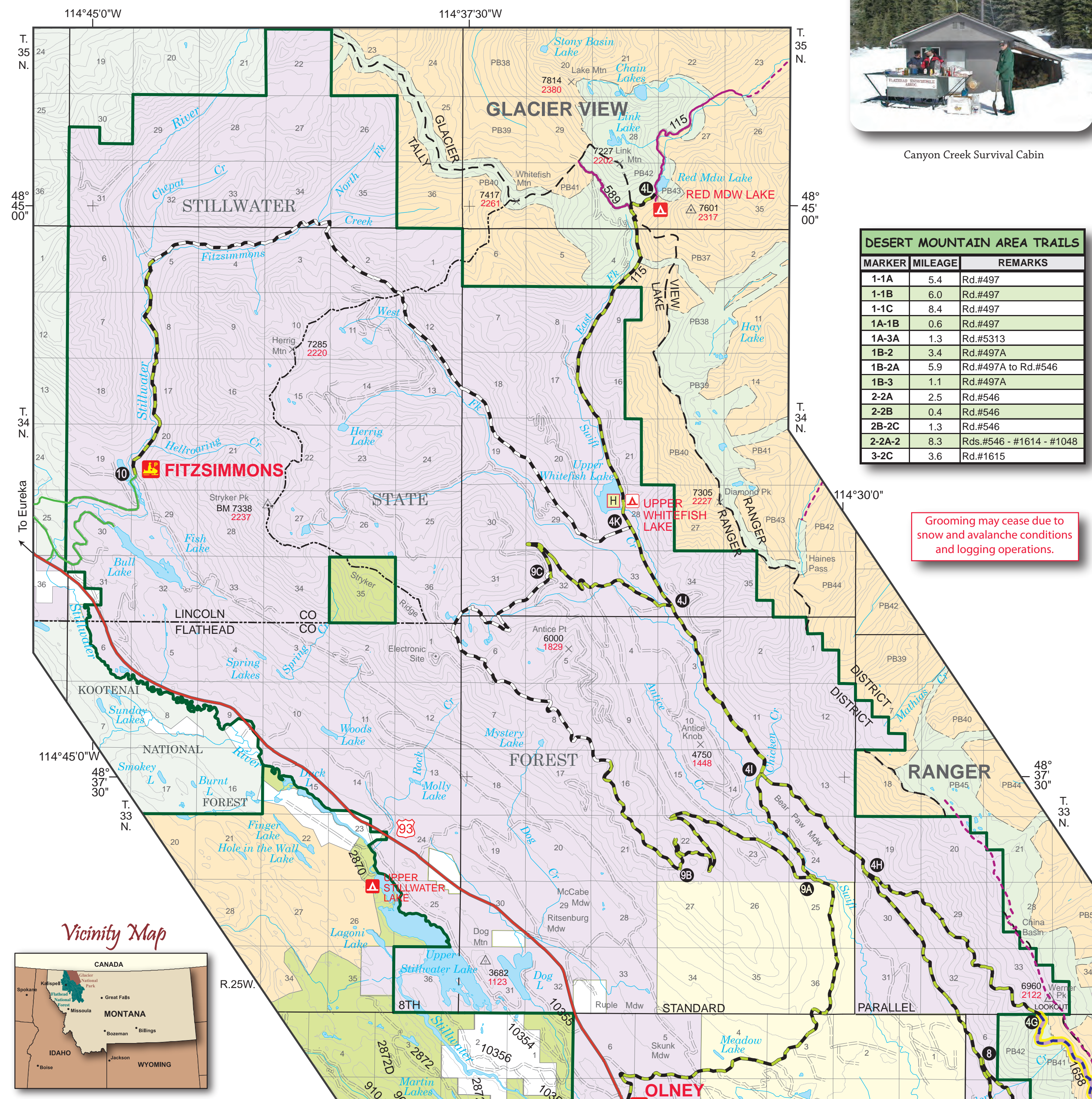

### State Lands Recreational Use License

All State Lands Recreational Use License is required when snowmobiling on State Trust Lands. They can be purchased from Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks license agents or online at: [www.app.mt.gov/als/index/index.html](http://www.app.mt.gov/als/index/index.html)

### State Snowmobile Registration

All snowmobilers must display a current registration sticker on public lands.

Montana residents must register their snowmobiles at the County Treasurer's Office in the county where the owner resides. This is a one-time registration and valid until the current owner sells the snowmobile.

Residents must also purchase a Trail Pass (since October 1, 2016) to ride on any of the 4,000 miles of groomed snowmobile trails. A Resident Trail Pass is valid for three seasons and costs \$18. Trail Passes apply to all "mechanized equipment" including snowmobiles, motorized snow bikes, and fat tire pedal bikes. Nonresidents who plan to ride their snowmobiles and motorized snow bikes in Montana must purchase a Snowmobile Nonresident Temporary Use Permit for \$25 per machine. You can:

- Apply Online** - You may apply for your Resident Trail Pass or Nonresident Snowmobile Permit through the online licensing system at: [www.app.mt.gov/als/index/index.html](http://www.app.mt.gov/als/index/index.html)
- Paper Application** - You may print the Snowmobile Nonresident Temporary Use Permit application, fill it out, and mail it back to Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (address is on the application).

**Vendor List** - You can apply for a Snowmobile Nonresident Temporary Use Permit or a Resident Trail Pass at one of the many vendors in Montana, Idaho, Washington, and Wyoming.
