EMERGENCY FOREST ORDER

EXIT GLACIER

Temporary Fire Prohibition

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.50 (a) and (b), the following restrictions are in effect on the Chugach National Forest for the Exit Glacier area. These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations. **This order will be in effect from June 30, 2017 through July 9, 2017 and expire at midnight on July 9, 2017.**

Prohibited Acts:

36 CFR 261.52 – Fire

Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire or stove fire including charcoal within the Exit Glacier area shown in Exhibit A [36 CFR 261.52(a)]

Exceptions:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or Local Law Enforcement Officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Penalty:

Violations of these Prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months or both. [16 U.S.C. 551, and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571]

Exhibit A

This Order applies to both sides of the Exit Glacier Road (FH 46) on all National Forest land and water areas on the southern end of the Seward Ranger District, northwest of Seward in the Resurrection River Valley, in portions of T1N, R1W, section 18 and 19; T1N, R2W, sections 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14. The area of closure extends south from the road easement to the Forest boundary (Resurrection River) and north from the road easement for a distance of one half mile; starting at the forest boundary gate as you enter the area from the east; westward approximately 4 miles to the bridge across Resurrection River at the boundary of Kenai Fjords National Park.
