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Legal Notice USDA Forest Service Southwestern Region

On April 27, 2018, Regional Forester Calvin Joyner approved the Record of Decision (ROD) for the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) to the Land and Resource Management Plan (Forest Plan) for the Coronado National Forest in Arizona. The 1986 Coronado Land and Resource Management Plan (as amended) was revised, utilizing the 1982 planning regulations, as accessed through the 2012 Planning Rule at 36 CFR 219.17(b)(3).

The ROD, FEIS and revised Coronado Forest Plan are now being circulated to organizations and interested members of the public. The Decision approves a revised Plan for the management of the Coronado National Forest over the next 15 years. This plan provides the context for development of specific projects that will be implemented to achieve the desired conditions expressed in the plan.

For this plan decision, the Regional Forester has elected to use the "Optional Procedures Available during the Planning Rule Transition Period" (hereafter called the Optional Appeal Procedures, the former 36 CFR 217 appeal procedures that were in effect prior to November 9, 2000, as accessed through the prior planning regulation transition provisions at 36 CFR 219.35 Appendix A, revised as of July 1, 2010). A written notice of appeal must be filed in duplicate and postmarked or received within 90 days after the date of publication of this legal notice in the newspaper(s) of record. The 90-day appeal filing period will commence on the publication date of this legal notice, anticipated to be June 22, 2018. Appeals must be filed by September 20, 2018.

The appeal must clearly state that it is a Notice of Appeal being filed pursuant to the Optional Appeal Procedures.
