



Dispersed Recreation and Grazing

Eligible Objectors & Interested Persons for this issue:

- The Lands Council

Objections:

- The revised Land Management Plan (LMP) and final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) fail to fairly discuss the most pressing public concerns about livestock grazing impacts to recreation users, in violation of the National Forest Management Act and National Environmental Policy Act.
- The revised LMP and FEIS fail to protect recreation infrastructure, sensitive plants, and water resources from grazing abuses, which negatively affects recreation users and the rural tourism economy.

Resolution Options Proposed by Objectors:

- Close cattle and sheep grazing above 5,000' in the Kettle Crest to protect the Pacific Northwest National Scenic Trail, sensitive plants, wildlife and water sources.
- Require range permittees to repair damage to recreation trails and water sources caused by their livestock.
