

## CLOSURE ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR RESTRICTING OCCUPANCY AND USE, TO WIT: MONONGAHELA NATIONAL FOREST, WEST VIRGINIA

Pursuant to the provisions of 16 U.S.C. § 551, and 36 C.F.R. §§ 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited in the Monongahela National Forest, West Virginia due to hazards associated with the COVID-19 virus.

## 1. The following are prohibited:

a. Being within an area or facility listed in this Order, and as shown on the map attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A (dated 03/27/2020), as closed for reasons of public health and safety. 36 CFR § 261.53(e).

The following areas are ordered closed on the Monongahela National Forest:

- All Developed Campgrounds
- All Developed Day Use Areas (including visitor centers, picnic areas, observation towers, Highland Scenic Highway overlooks, and historic sites)
- Middle Mountain Cabins
- Dispersed (roadside) camping along the Cranberry and Williams Rivers
- All toilet facilities
- b. Using any area within Monongahela National Forest by a group larger than ten (10) people at one time. Groups larger than 10 people must split into smaller groups and recreate at least 200 yards apart. 36 CFR § 261.58 (f).
- 2. **Duration:** The prohibitions of this Order shall remain in effect until terminated by the Forest Supervisor.
- 3. **Exemptions:** Pursuant to 36 CFR §261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from the prohibitions contained in this Order:
  - a. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission (36 CFR 261.50(e)(1));
  - b. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty (36 CFR 261.50(e)(4).
- 4. **General Prohibitions:** The General Prohibitions set forth in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A (§§261.1-261.23), remain in effect. The prohibitions set forth herein pursuant to 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart B (§§261.50-261.58) are in addition to the General Prohibitions.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).
