DIRECTIONS

Welcome Center: 30239 IL-53, Wilmington, IL 60481

The Midewin Welcome Center is located approximately 2.5 miles north of Wilmington on Hwy. 53. The building is on the east side of the highway.

GPS Coordinate: 41°20'36.5"N 88°07'54.5"W

Iron Bridge Trailhead: The Iron Bridge Trailhead is located 2.7 miles from the Midewin Welcome Center (30239 IL State Route 53, Wilmington, IL 60481). Going north from the Welcome Center on Hwy. 53, turn right at the gravel road just after the Iron Bridge. The entrance to the trailhead is on the east side of the highway. Drive in about a quarter mile until you reach a large parking lot.

Birds of Midewin Hike Saturday, June 13 8:30 to 10:30 a.m.

You might see blue grosbeaks, loggerhead shrikes, bobolinks, grasshopper sparrows, blackbilled cuckoos, mockingbirds, and brown thrashers. Bring your binoculars! This 2-hour east side walking tour will

begin at the Welcome Center. Participants will follow tour guides to the Iron Bridge Trailhead to start the hike.

Prairie Farmstead Hike Saturday, June 27 9:30 to 11 a.m.

Preferable by far to the timberlands.—HENRY J. ABLE, 1838. Although we often focus on the transformation of the old arsenal to restored tallgrass prairie, it was actually during the agricultural era of Midewin, from 1830 to 1940, when most of the prairie disappeared under the sizzle of the self-scouring steel plow. During this 90-minute walk, learn about the National Register-eligible Rodgers/Schumacher Farmstead that was continuously farmed from the mid-19th century to 1940, and then, once the buildings were removed, was preserved in time. On the night of July 6, 1840, Eliza Steele, a young woman from the East Coast, boarded a stagecoach in Chicago. She was headed for Peoria. As the sun rose the next day, she awoke to something she had never seen before. "I was in the midst of a prairie!" she wrote. Her diary noted that she was just south of Joliet. What did she see here? Meet at the Iron Bridge Trailhead Ranger Trailer.

A "Midewin Sampler!" On Gifford Pinchot's birthday, celebrate the life of the man who started the USDA Forest Service on this guided walk along the Henslow Trail.
