Special Forest Products Do Not Collect Fungi Species

The following are rare fungi on the Willamette National Forest. We ask that you do not collect any of these Regional Forester's sensitive species. If you do collect them by accident, we request that you please contact the Forest Botany Program Manager (Thomas.McGinnis@usda.gov) and send him pictures of the mushroom sliced in half to show the outside and inside (including staining if present) to aid in identification. Please include a description and/or coordinates of where you found the species so we can document and protect the site.
