Safety First: Danger Trees







Standing dead and fire-weakened danger trees along roads can fall unpredictably, causing injury or death to people and damage to property or infrastructure.

The Forest Service has a responsibility to either **mitigate these danger trees** along forest roads or **close fire-impacted roads** to all entry.



Indefinite road closures impacts local communities, utility companies, tourism economies, and private landowners.

Danger tree removal along roads provides improved safety and access for:



Wildfire suppression



Restoration & recovery projects



Forest visitors & employees



Partner agencies



Commercial uses & outfitter guides



Emergency responders

Mitigation is **targeted along roads** where danger trees **pose a safety risk** to people, property, and/or infrastructure. The **vast majority of forestland** inside fire-impacted areas receives **no danger tree removal**.
