

MINIMUM CAMPING DISTANCE MAP FOR BEAR LAKE

Please remember, camping less than 100 feet from water, trails, or posted signs is prohibited.



Help Keep It Wild:

- By camping away from water, you help reduce the amount of human waste, chemicals, and trash entering waterways, which in turn keeps it clean for people and wildlife,
- By camping away from trails, you allow others more opportunities to experience solitude.
- By camping away from sign postings, you help fragile vegetation recover from human impacts and improve wildlife habitat.
- 100 ft (40 large steps) is the minimum required distance from water, trails, and postings according to Regulation 36 CFR 261.58(e).
- 200 ft (80 large steps) is The Leave No Trace (LNT) minimum recommended distance from all of the above.
- This map is for reference only. Visitors are responsible for determining if their camp meets the required 100 ft minimum distances.

Note: Camping near cliff edges that are directly above the lake is prohibited. Distance from water to your camp is measured horizontally, not on the slope line.
