IDLEWILD ACCESS AREA FLOOD RECOVERY PROJECT

Pursuant to Title 16 U.S.C. § 551, and 36CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System (NFS) lands within the Canyon Lakes Ranger District of the Roosevelt National Forest, Larimer County, Colorado, described below and shown on the attached map incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A (the “Restricted Area”). The purpose of this Order is to allow the Idlewild access area the proper amount of time to recover from flood damage and to protect public health and safety.

RESTRICTED AREA:

- An approximately 26-acre area south of U.S. Route 34 and east of mile marker 77 in T5N, R71W, Section 2 Sixth Principal Meridian (the “Idlewild Access Area”) as shown on Exhibit A.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Being in the Idlewild Access Area. When provided in an order, it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of: Threatened, endangered, rare, unique, or vanishing species of plants, animals, birds or fish. 36 CFR 261.53(a); Public health or safety. 36 CFR 261.53(e).

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty;
2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
3. Emergency repair contractors working within the Restricted Area.

This Order becomes effective when signed and shall remain in effect for three years from date of signature or until rescinded, whichever occurs first.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C §§ 3559, 3571, 3581).
