Trail Description

Dropping approximately 1900 feet in elevation, the Dome Trail offers a good workout with a rewarding destination. As you descend through the forest, beautiful canyon views present many photo opportunities. The trail leaves the forest, skirting Bald Rock Dome along a narrow ledge. Guard railing and a stairway aid your descent to the Middle Fork of the Feather River. The last stretch to the river has no trail. Some skill is required to reach the water's edge. After lunch, take a rock-hopping walk upstream to Curtain Falls. This is a great attraction you don't want to miss. Bring plenty of water with you. The trail gets especially hot in the summer months.

(The trail is generally open from May to November, snow and road conditions permitting.)

Be Aware:

Not recommended for novice hikers Remote area (Bring a first aid kit) River is fast and cold



Note:

Open water sources are easily contaminated by human or animal waste. Water from springs, lakes, ponds, and streams should be properly treated before drinking. One recommended method of treatment is to bring clear water to a rolling boil for five minutes.
