

UNPREDICTABLE WINDS

The winds can shift at any time and vary greatly from place to place along the 51-mile long lake. Winds can be quite strong with the strongest down lake winds occurring April–July. High winds create large waves so paddlers should be prepared to take shelter. Generally, early mornings and late afternoons are calmest, although wind patterns can change abruptly based on daily variations. Venturing through "the narrows" and beyond should only be attempted by experienced paddlers.



PADDLING ONE-WAY

It is possible to kayak one-way (i.e. from Stehekin to Lucerne) by riding with one of the passenger ferries that service Lake Chelan. Kayaks are allowed with an additional fee by reservation only.

FEDERAL DOCKS and CAMPSITES

All public docks north of Twenty-five Mile Creek State Park are managed under a federal dock fee program administered by the U.S. Forest Service and National Park Service

- \$75/season or \$10/day.

Dock Permit Info:

There are 10 Forest Service and 4 Park Service docks with campsites, including picnic tables, fire rings and toilets.

Boat-in campsites on Lake Chelan are all first come, first serve, no reservations. Kayakers who intend to pull their boats ashore and not utilize a dock space, do not need a permit.

PARKING/LAUNCHING


Fields Point Landing and Twenty-five Mile Creek State Park are popular places to launch.
