## FOSSIL RIDGE WILDERNESS and FOSSIL RIDGE RECREATION MANAGEMENT AREA

GRAND MESA, UNCOMPAHGRE and GUNNISON NATIONAL FORESTS

The following acts are *prohibited* on National Forest System land within the **FOSSIL RIDGE WILDERNESS and FOSSIL RIDGE RECREATION MANAGEMENT AREA** of the Grand Mesa, Uncompangre, and Gunnison National Forests.

<u>FOSSIL RIDGE WILDERNESS</u>

- 1. Entering or being in the restricted area with more than 15 people per group, with a maximum combination group size not to exceed 25 people and/or stock. 36 CFR 261.58 (f)
- 2. Camping within one hundred (100) feet of any lake, stream, or National Forest System Trail. 36 CFR 261.58 (e)
- 3. Building, maintaining or using a campfire:
  - a) within one hundred (100) feet of any lake or stream.
  - b) above treeline. 36 CFR 261.52 (a)
- 4. Storing equipment, personal property, or supplies for longer than seven calendar (7) days. 36 CFR 261.57 (f)
- 5. Confining any pack or saddle animal within one hundred (100) feet of any lake, stream, or National Forest System Trail. 36 CFR 261.58 (aa)
  - Note: the term "confining" is defined as picketing, highlining, hitching, tethering or corraling.
- 6. Possessing a dog which is not under control, or which is harassing or damaging wildlife, people, or property. <u>Note</u>: the term "under control" is defined as the dog being leashed, and/or under direct verbal control by the dogs' owner or handler at all times. 36 CFR 261.58 (s)
- 7. Shortcutting a switchback in a trail. 36 CFR 261.55 (e)

## FOSSIL RIDGE RECREATION MANAGEMENT AREA

- 1. Camping within one hundred (100) feet of any lake, stream, or National Forest System Trail. 36 CFR 261.58 (e)
- 2. Building, maintaining or using a campfire:
  - a) within one hundred (100) feet of any lake or stream.
  - b) above treeline. 36 CFR 261.52 (a)
- **3.** Confining any pack or saddle animal within 100 feet of any lake or stream. 36 CFR 261.58 (aa) *Note*: the term "confining" is defined as picketing, highlining, hitching, tethering or corraling.
- 4. Possessing a dog which is not under control, or which is harassing or damaging wildlife, people, or property. <u>Note</u>: the term "under control" is defined as the dog being leashed, and/or under direct verbal control by the dogs' owner or handler at all times. 36 CFR 261.58 (s)
- 5. Shortcutting a switchback in a trail. 36 CFR 261.55 (e)
