
## Nantahala and Pisgah National Forests Heritage Resources Desired Conditions


- Significant prehistoric and historic sites and resources are preserved and protected for their cultural importance and retain their historical and scientific research value.
- All known cultural resources are evaluated for eligibility to the National Register of Historic Places.
- Cultural resource protection efforts span boundaries to encompass collaboration with other government, public, and private partnerships.
- Collections are available to researchers and the public for research and interpretation.
- American Indian tribes and individuals retain a connection to the land that fosters both traditional and contemporary cultural uses of the Forests.
- Traditionally used resources are not depleted and are available for future generations.
- Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) from American Indian tribes and other sources is considered in forest management.
- The cultural landscape retains characteristic American Indian elements, including archeological sites, former Cherokee Towns, historic trail corridors and other Tribal use areas.









