## TRAIL NAME: #1133 LOST LAKE

**TRAIL BEGINNING:** 9900' elevation (3018m) junction of #1101 and #1133.

**LENGTH:** .11 mi (.18km)

TRAIL ENDING: 9900' elevation (3018m) at Lost Lake

**RECOMMENDED SEASON:** 

Summer | Fall

**ACCESS:** On Hwy 40, go southeast of Steamboat Springs about 21 miles to the Dumont Lake turn-off. Follow the old highway to NFSR 311 at the stone monument. Parking is provided here or the unimproved road continues to Base Camp trailhead 4 miles up NFSR 311. Park here without obstructing the TH and begin hiking trail #1101. Approximately 2 miles down the trail, the #1133 trail begins on the right.

**USE:** Heavy

**DIFFICULTY:** Easy

**USGS MAP(S):** Mount Werner

Quad.

ATTRACTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS: The Lost Lake Trail is accessed only off of the Wyoming Trail #1101. Therefore, several ways exist to access this trail other than Rabbit Ears Pass. From the north take the Buffalo Pass Road and go south from the summit on the #1101 **OR** from the west, Fish Creek Falls Trail #1102 to #1101. In this area trails #1101 and #1102 are open to moutain bikes and are very popular trails. Please be aware of your surroundings.

**NARRATIVE:** The Lost Lake Trail is only 1/5 mile. It winds thru a mature spruce and fir forest and boggy areas before dead-ending at the lake. The lake is beautiful and surrounded by forest. Camping and fishing are quite popular here.
