

Nez Perce-Clearwater Timber Suitability

This map displays a breakdown of lands used to determine the suitability of timber production on the Nez Perce-Clearwater National Forests. Each land classification was removed in succession from the acres that may be suitable for timber production sequentially in the order shown below. Because of overlap, the acres shown for individual land classes will not represent the total amount in the plan area (with the exception of wilderness, which was removed first)
