Length: Approximately 9 miles.

Directions: Take Scenic 7 Byway, 6 miles north of Jessieville Visitor Center. Turn west on Forest Service Road 11.

Trail Information: The course follows several Forest Service Roads that are open to motorized vehicles. Road signs and trail signposts mark the route. Road surface is unpaved.

Site Amenities: Parking is available at trailhead on Forest Service Road 11 and at Deckard Mountain Vista.

Difficulty level: Easiest.

Safety: Watch for oncoming traffic. Bicycles, hikers and motorized vehicles share this route. Bring drinking water.

Requirements: Obey all posted signs. **Recommended Seasons:** Open all year.
