Forest Ranger Brackett, who has his headquarters at the Geo. Voorheis ranch, arrested a man named Harry Gibford Wednesday morning for leaving a camp fire burning on the reserve about two miles above the Elliott ranch. Gibford and his wife had been to Wisdom with a load of vegetables from over in Idaho and had camped there Tuesday night on his return journey. When they broke camp next morning they either neglected or forgot to put out their fire, and Ranger Brackett, who passed that way shortly after they left extinguished the fire and rode after the couple and placed them under arrest. They were taken before Justice of the Peace Woodworth, but as no damage had been done and as it was a first offense, allowed them to go, after a reprimand.
