POREST FIRES BECOME WORSE THROUGHOUT DISTRICT

How Mlases Break Out in Various Places and Some Old Ones Get Beyond Control

BACK PIRE NEAR CITY

The Placer check fire get away this afternoon and in a short time was burning in 100 places. On one side of the creek it has burned as far as Livingston's place. Supervisor Weigle said this afternoon that he would back fire tenight between Livingston's cabin and Wallace to prevent the fire coming any measure to Wallace. A force of men will be put to work at once outting a trail from anderson gulch so that back firing and tranching can be done. Supervisor Weigle said late this afternoon that the only danger to Wallace at present is due to flying brands. The back firing will step the appreces of flames to the city.

Wallace was clouded by smoke this afternoon worse than at any time in the past ten days, the sum being almost bletted out and electric lights being acceptable in business houses.

The cause is believed to be the bad fire that is burning along the Mullan read by Molte's Gulch. The fire is a continuation of the Rock creek fire near Mullan. Much green timber is being burned and the smoke is heavy. The fire is a short distance above the City Dairy.

A fierce blase broke out near the Legal Tender mine between here and Kellegg this afternoon and it is burning fibroely. It is reported to be burning toward the Plaris, the mining property of Senator Hayburn. The formestry effice was informed of the fire and the authorities notified the G. R. & M. Semeral Agent Marshall quickly get a force of men together and they were sent down to the fire on the afternoon train.

"The fire is fearful," said Mrs. Haller at the logal Tender mine at 3 e'clock this afterneen, and it looks as though it will commune all of the timber in this section. At present there is only a small force of men fighting it. A spark blown from the Spokume passenger train undoubtedly started it.

The Big Greek fire got away from the fire fighters, as has also the one on Placer creek.

Ranger Williams, who is in charge of the forest fire at Marray, telephoned in teday that the fire had jumped from one mountain ridge to another and is going toward Marray.
