

## What is a "trail"?

A trail is a narrow highway over which a pack animal can travel with safety during the usual period when the need for a highway exists.

Trail construction on the National Forests, Forest Service, 1915

- A corridor or path to connect places where people wanted to go - villages, food, water
8 An administrative tool for management of the forest - check livestock, mining, supply lookouts and fight forest fires
- Access to recreation opportunities campgrounds, lodges, backcountry

- 2 trailheads - Owl Creek CG \& Pinetorch
- Camping Owl Creek


## Flint Creek multiple use

- 16.5 miles
- 2 loops blazed
§ ATV's, motorcycles, mountain bikes, horses \& hikers
- Day Use Trailhead


## Sipsey Wilderness

- 13.3 miles horse \& wagon-2 routes
¢ 33.4 miles hiking - 9 trails
- NO bikes or motorized
- Minimal signing \& maintenance


## Recreation Area Trails

- Clear Creek - Raven hiking trail 2.4 miles
- Clear Creek bicycle/walking trail 1.8 miles
- Houston - hiking trail 3.0 miles
- Brushy Lake - walking 0.5 miles

- Natural Bridge - walking 0.5 miles
