

TRAILS  
SIERRA ANCHA WILDERNESS

There is a network of “system” trails serving the Sierra Ancha Wilderness Area and contiguous areas. Their condition varies from satisfactory to very poor. All trails are closed to motor vehicles and mechanical transport such as bikes.

Use a great deal of caution when traveling on backcountry trails such as this one and be aware of the risks you assume.

A few brief comments are in order about the following trail:

**Abbey’s Way 151:** 2.0 miles in length. The western end of this trail begins on the Workman creek Road 487, skirts the meadow where the old Peterson Place was located, and then climbs through a mixed-conifer forest up to Aztec Peak where it again joins Road 487. This trail is outside of the designated Wilderness, but provides excellent views into it. Elevation: 6910 - 7720 feet. Difficulty level: Most Difficult. Use level: Moderate. Restrictions: Closed to all motorized equipment, bike or other mechanical transport. Trailheads: **Peterson TH** and **Aztec TH**.

No more than 15 people are allowed to be in a group. No more than 15 head of livestock are allowed in a group.
