SPECIAL ORDER ORDER NO. # 97-4

WHITE RIVER NATIONAL FOREST

AND

DILLON DISTRICT, ARAPAHO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551, 36 CFR 261.50(a) and 261.50(b), the following are prohibited on all National Forest system lands, roads, trails and improvements on the White River National Forest and the Dillon District of the Arapaho National Forest until further notice:

 It is prohibited to use any motorized vehicle on Forest development roads that do not display a current or valid state license as required by Colorado State law (Title 42-Colorado Revised Statues (CRS), sections 3124 and 3103.

2. It is prohibited to use or possess an Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) or over-the-snow vehicle on Forest development roads that do not display a current valid state off-highway registration as required by Colorado State law (Title 33-CRS, article 14, section 102, and article 14.5, section 102.

36 CFR 261.54(b)

- 3. It is prohibited to use or possess an OHV or over-the-snow vehicle on any Forest development trail that does not display a current and valid state off-highway registration as required by Colorado State law (Title 33-CRS, article 14, section 102, and article 14.5, section 102 36 CFR 261.55(b)
- 4. It is prohibited to camp, or otherwise occupy any location for a period longer than fourteen (14) days within any 30-day period.

 36 CFR 261.58(a)

NOTE: Specific areas may have stricter camping limits in effect if needed.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following persons are exempted from this order:

- 1. Persons and private landowners with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
