TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES

The following roads on the Dillon District of the Arapaho National Forest will be closed annually from December 1 to July 15 to vehicle use [36 CFR 261.54(e)] except snowmobiles operating on snow. This closure is necessary to: (1) maintain public safety, (2) prevent excessive road damage and soil loss during the spring runoff period, and (3) to protect the revegetation and erosion control projects being carried out from redisturbance caused by uncontrolled vehicle access.

The roads or segments thereof may be opened prior to July 15, 1986, if conditions warrant.

SPRUCE CREEK ROAD - NO. 225.1b

Starting at its junction with FDR 225 in Section 13, T.7S., R.78W., west to its terminus.

ACUADUCT ROAD - NO. 225.1c

Starting at its junction with FDR 225 in Section 13, T.7S., R.87W., west to its terminus.

MAYFLOWER GULCH ROAD - NO. 233

From the point 1.5 miles east of State Highway 91, the intersection of South Mayflower Creek and the road and continuing southeast to its terminus (S.E. 1/4, Section 30, T.7S., R.7OW.).

KEYSTONE GULCH ROAD - NO. 217

From the Keystone Gulch Trailhead .25 mile south of its junction with Soda Creek Road to its terminus at the Erickson Mine (S.E. 1/4, Section 23, T.5S., R.77W.).

RAINBOW LAKE ROAD - NO. 284

From its junction with County Shop Road No. 1004 to its terminus at 219.1 Miners Creek Road (S.E. 1/3, Section 35, T.5S., R.87W.).

MINERS CREEK ROAD - NO. 219.1

From its junction with Rainbow Lake Road No. 284 to its terminus at the Miners Creek Four-wheel Drive Trailhead (N.W. 1/4, Section 2, T.6S., R.87W.).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following is exempted from this order:

- 1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission; and
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local official, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Any person wishing to use a Forest road or trail, or a portion of the National Forest System should contact the Forest Supervisor, Director, Administrator, or District Ranger to ascertain the special restrictions which may be applicaable thereto.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both (16 USC 551).
