## ORDER OCCUPANCY AND USE REGULATIONS

ARAPAHO NATIONAL FOREST (ADMINISTERED BY THE WHITE RIVER NATIONAL FOREST)

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Section 261.50(a), the following act is prohibited on the area described below, and as shown on Exhibit A, within the Arapaho National Forest, effective November 1 until May 31 annually, until further notice.

(1) Going into, or being upon, the area described below which is closed for the protection of public health or safety. 36 CFR 261.53(e)

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Section 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- (1) Persons with a USDA Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
- (2) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

The area closed is 15 feet in width adjacent to the Copper Mountain Resort boundary as follows: From the private property corner at 10,000 feet elevation above Highway 91, south toward Spaulding Gulch, then west to the summit of Copper Mountain, then south across Copper Creek, then west across the top of Tucker Mountain, then north, parallel to Jacque Creek and Guller Creek, to a three (3) foot break in the closed area at the 10,600 elevation level to provide an access point to Guller Creek, then continuing north to the private property corner immediately south of Interstate 70.

Violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months or both.
