

**SPECIAL ORDER
OCCUPANCY AND USE REGULATIONS
HOLY CROSS RANGER DISTRICT
WHITE RIVER NATIONAL FOREST**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.55 (a), the following act is *prohibited* within the **Holy Cross District** of the White River National Forest in Colorado, until further notice:

1. Being on a trail.

Nonsystem trails in the Stone Creek drainage T5S R81W Sections 17 and 18 locally known as Oso and the lower portion of Paulie's Sister, 2350W.


Middle Creek FDT 2135, located in T5S R80W Section 6.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, state, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force, in the performance of an official duty.

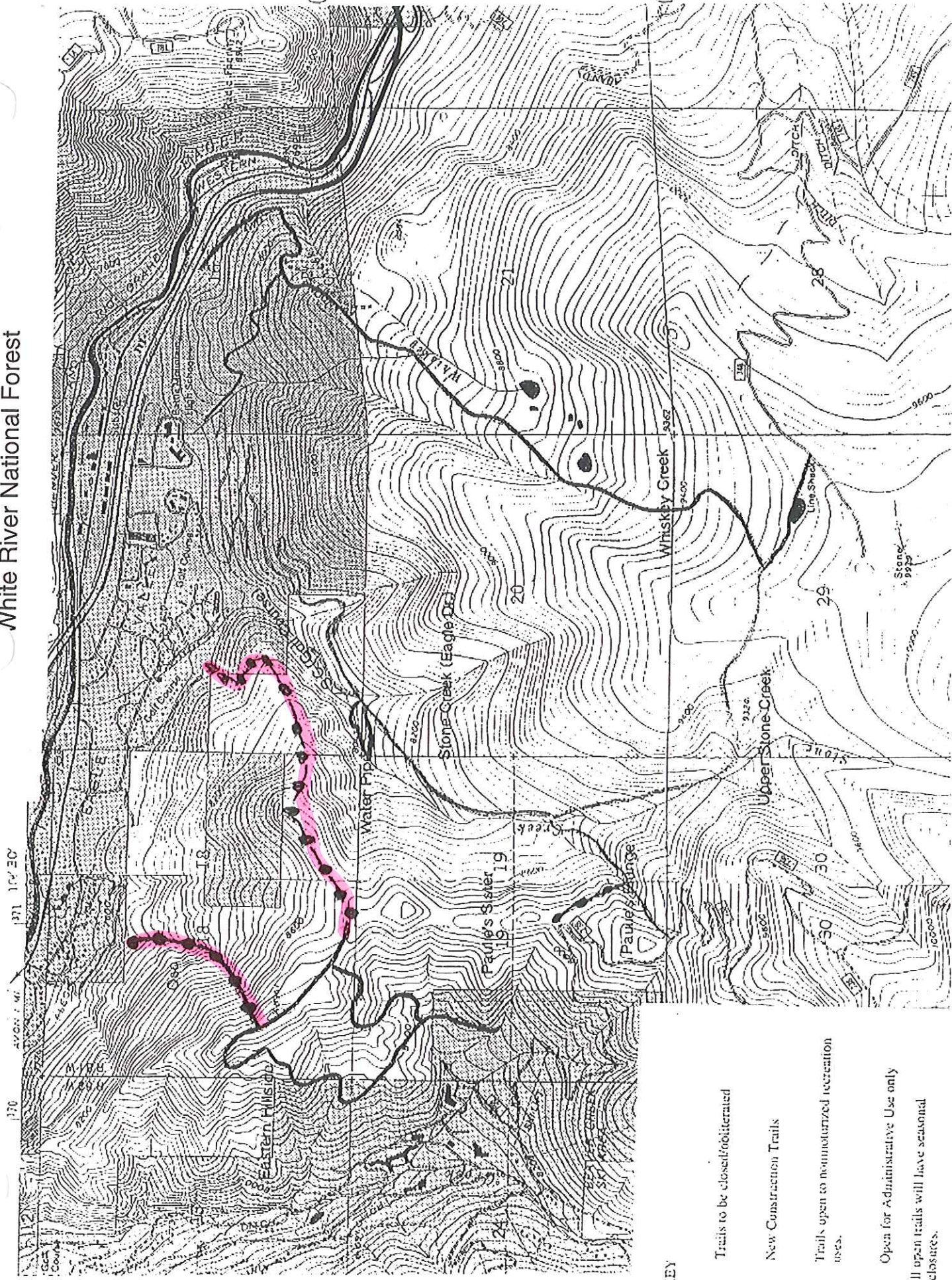
Violation of the above prohibited acts is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 and/or imprisonment for not more than 6 months. 16 USC 551; PL 98-473
