Description

The Delta National Forest has over 20 multiple-use trails. These trails range from 3/4 to 4 1/2 miles in distance. They provide the outdoor enthusiast and experience in both wooded and open environments. The trails traverse along low lands, waterways, and on reservoirs. The trails are open to vehicles less than 48 inches wide. Parking is available at all trailheads. Visitors should follow safety regulations, be aware of hunting seasons, and utilize forest maps for exact locations. Trail users may want to contact the District Office for additional information regarding the many trails available. There is a user fee. Fee stations are located at every trailhead throughout the forest for day use permits; however, annual permits can only be purchased at the District Office. No attendant will be on duty. Therefore, users should make sure that they have correct currency before arriving at the recreation area.
