
Cliff Camp Bridge: The historic Cliff Camp Bridge is a suspension bridge over the North Fork of the Kings River, downstream of Wishon Reservoir. The bridge was originally built by Kings River District Ranger Roy Boothe, along with clerk G. F. Leslie, and a party of mining men, in May of 1916. These men purchased the supplies from the Pacific Light and Power Co., in Big Creek, CA, and packed them into the site over 25 miles of snow. The bridge is a single span, 72' long, and 5' wide, over the river at a narrow granite gorge.



How to get there: From McKinley Grove Road, turn south on rough, native-surface Road 11S01 just before Wishon Reservoir and drive to the trail crossing (29E06 on Courtright Reservoir, CA USGS Quad; 28E07 on Rough Spur, CA USGS Quad). Hike the trail south to the bridge. The bridge is unsafe to cross, and the Sierra National Forest has erected barriers for safety reasons.
