





## How To Reduce Fire Hazards

Your assistance is needed in making the Angeles National Forest and the communities surrounding it, safe from wildfire. The following regulations are for your protection and are set forth under the Uniform Fire Code: "Every person owning, leasing, controlling, operating or maintaining any building, structure, or apiary in, upon, or joining any hazardous fire area, and any person owning, leasing or controlling any land adjacent to such building, structure or apiary shall, at all times":

1. Remove to bare soil for 4. Chimney and flue 30 feet, or to property line, openings must be covered with 1/2-inch wire mesh from all structures, all dead weeds, needles, leaves, spark arrester, visible from grass, and dead trees. the ground. 2. Remove all needles. 5. Remove tree limbs for 10 leaves and debris from feet away from chimney roofs. openings. 3. Remove all weeds, grass, 6. Remove accumulation brush, trash or other debris and haul to public combustible material a dump. minimum of 10 feet away from all liquid petroleum (propane) gas tanks or containers.

Screen ½ inch mesh screen on chimney outlet. To prevent smoke damage installation should be vertical.

Clean all needles and leaves off roof.



Remove limbs within 10 feet of chimney and dead limbs over handing buildings.

Clear all flammable vegetation within 30 feet of buildings.
