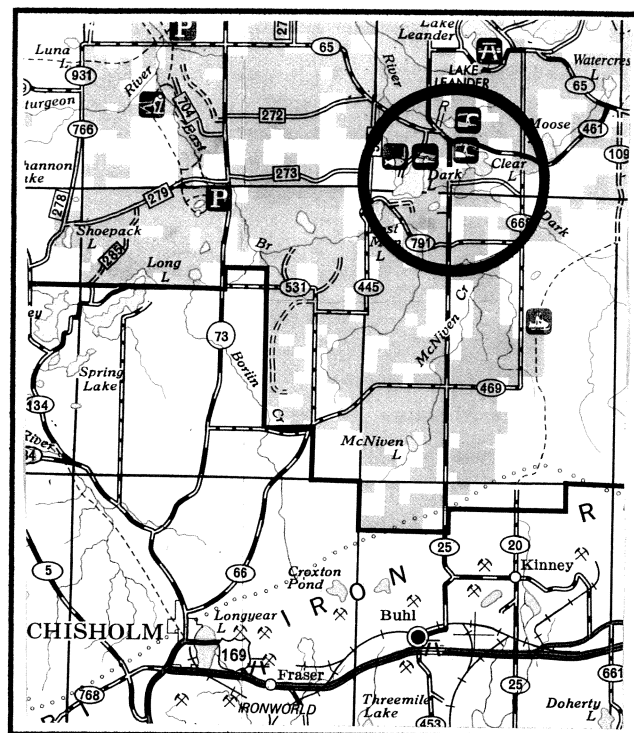

Location

These three lakes are located 10 miles north of Buhl, Minnesota.

■ Take Highway #25 north of Buhl for 10 miles to County Road #461. Turn right on #461 for 1/4 mile. On your left is Knuckey Lake; on your right is Clear Lake. Parking for Knuckey Lake is down a short gravel road. Parking for Clear Lake is alongside County Road #461.

■ To visit Dark Lake, drive north on Highway #25 for another 1/2 mile. Take a left at County #65 and take the North Dark Lake Road following the signs to the Dark Lake Boat Landing.



Features

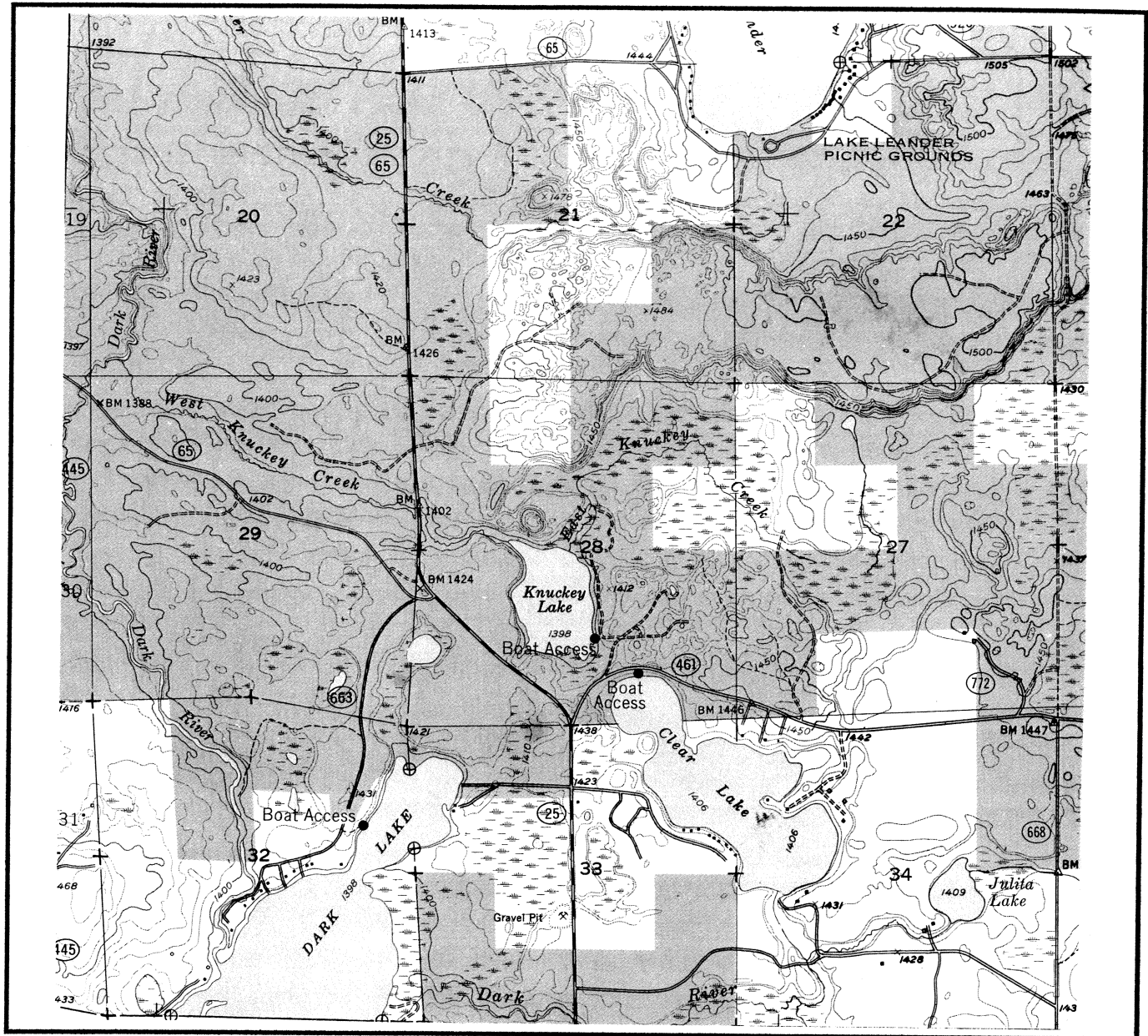
■ **Dark Lake** (244 acres) - Facilities at this area include a concrete boat ramp suitable for most boats, picnic site, accessible fishing deck, parking lot and vault toilet. The lake offers a wide variety of fish including walleye, northern pike and panfish. There are several residences along the lakeshore. Camping is not allowed at the boat landing.

■ **Clear Lake** (149 acres) - Boat access to this lake is a carry-down off the county road. It is suitable for canoes and small

boats. Parking has to be alongside the road so pull off as far as you can to avoid obstructing traffic. There are several privately-owned cabins on this lake. Predominant fish species are crappies, northern pike and bass. Loons are frequent visitors.

■ **Knuckey Lake** (71 acres) - The access road to this lake is 1/4 mile east of the junction of County Road #25 and #461. A gravel boat ramp with small turnaround area is located at the end of this road. The ramp is a little steep and is suitable for small boats and canoes. This lake offers northern pike, largemouth bass and panfish.

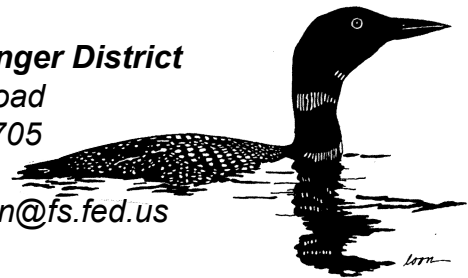
Superior National Forest - Dark Lake-Knuckey Lake-Clear Lake
