Recreation Program Fee Accomplishment Report 2009











Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested locally in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use and value.

Accomplishments provided with recreation fees on the Bitterroot National Forest:

- Provided a variety of interpretive programs at recreation sites. Supported Darby Elementary School's participation in "Keep Como Clean campaign;" students were taught environmental education themes and created posters depicting their chosen theme. Posters were displayed in the campgrounds.
- Partnered with Trapper Creek Job Corps: thinned trees in recreation sites and cleared trees that had fallen in roads.
- Lake Como Recreation Area:
 - Painted picnic table, benches, information boards, outhouse interiors, BBQ grills, water spigots, and the fence at Lower Campground.
 - Striped parking lot, parking lanes at boat ramp and beach areas.
 - Lengthened campground host site in Upper Campground.
 - o Installed a welcome sign on a poured concrete base with rock masonry work finish.
 - Installed barrier rocks for resource protection on the west end of the beach and hauled in and spread 80 yards of sand.
 - Repaired, relocated, stained and installed signs at Rock Creek Horse Camp and the boat launch access and exit roads.
- Installed new signs and painted the fence and accessible fishing platform at Spring Gulch Campground.
- Installed new signs, and painted road arrows and tables at Indian Trees Campground.
- Recreation Rentals: Stained Gird Point Lookout. Built new furniture for Gird Point, Magruder Ranger's House, Lost Horse Cabin and East Fork Guard Station. Completed minor repairs and maintenance at all recreation rentals.
- Completed maintenance and cleaning tasks at all recreations sites and campgrounds: removed hazard trees, painted picnic tables, pumped vault toilets, and completed water tests.
- Administered and monitored 38 outfitter and guide permits, as well as other special use permits for recreation events.

Special Feature

Using REA funds in 2009, historic Woods Cabin received a new foundation and deck. This project was a joint effort between the National Park Service Preservation Team, youth from Trapper Creek Job Corps and district employees. The new foundation may not be the first thing visitors notice, but it will ensure this cabin is available to enjoy for years to come.


