Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

Cabins and Lookouts

 Purchased supplies and completed cleaning and maintenance tasks at rental cabins and lookouts.

Outfitter and Guide Special Use Program

- Funded a River Ranger who patrolled Lochsa River and provided visitor information and education and monitored resources.
- Administered and inspected outfitter and guide special use permit operations.
- Completed maintenance projects on trails used by outfitters and guides, which included removing a substantial number of trees fallen across trails.

Campgrounds

- Supported hosts at Elk Creek, Little Boulder, Laird Park, Washington Creek Powell, Wendover, White Sands, Whitehouse, Wilderness Gateway, Apgar and Wild Goose campgrounds who provided visitor information and assistance, and completed maintenance and cleaning tasks. These volunteers contributed over 5,000 hours of work during the summer season.
- Funded garbage removal and regular maintenance at campgrounds.
- Extended open season in Little Boulder and Elk Creek campgrounds.
- Installed new bulletin boards at Aquarius, Washington Creek, Noe Creek, Kelly Forks and Hidden Creek campgrounds.
