

Access: Travel 11 miles northwest of Fort Collins on U.S. Highway 287. Turn left onto Colorado Highway 14, and travel 52 miles to County Road 103, Laramie River Road. Turn right and travel north about 16 miles to County Road 80C, Glendevey Road. Turn left and travel about 3 miles to the Link and McIntyre Trailhead parking on the left just past Browns Park Campground.

**Trail Information:** The Link Trail climbs steadily for about 5 miles through lodgepole pine and a recovering burned area from a fire in 1876. The trail levels somewhat and continues south for another 4 miles. The trail ends at the Rawah Trail (#961) near Rawah Lake No. 1 and after a junction with the north end of the McIntyre Lake Trail (964). McIntyre Lake is located a mile south of this junction. Camping spots can be found along the edges of the burn, along a short distance of the Medicine Bow Trail, along a drainage just north of McIntyre Lake, and in a large meadow located south of McIntyre Lake and east of the McIntyre Lake trail before it descends to intersect the Rawah Trail.
