HABITAT LOSS Young forests provide essential nesting cover and are critical to wild turkey survival. New Hampshire alone has lost 90 percent of young forest habitat in the past 30 years.

FORESTS Lack of timber harvests and the reduction of use of controlled burns have made our northern forests less productive for wildlife.


SURVIVAL Brutal winter weather and the lack of dependable winter food sources have had an increasingly negative impact on wild turkeys in recent years.
