HABITAT LOSS Development and urban sprawl have altered the southern landscape. We must work to maximize wildlife use of the remaining habitat.



HEALTHY FORESTS Only 3 percent of the Southeast's original longleaf pine forest remains. This native species has been replaced by forests that aren't as wildlife friendly.



HABITAT DIVERSITY Active timber management and using controlled burns creates the wide range of habitat types wildlife needs to thrive, including forests of all ages.

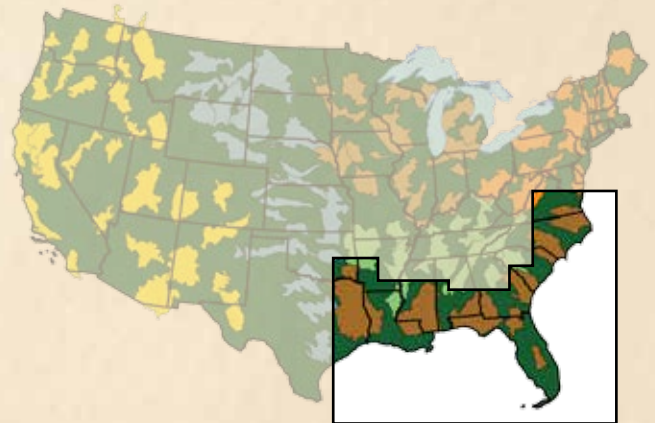
THE NWTF WILL LEAD A SOUTHERN PINE REVIVAL
