1/ DEFINITION OF UNITS:

National forests.---Areas established as national forests by legislative or executive action. Acres shown as national forest land, and other land administered by the Forest Service include small administrative sites outside of proclaimed boundaries and those portions of land utilization projects and other areas over which the Forest Service has supervision located within the national-forest boundaries. Land utilization and other areas located outside the national forests and under Forest Service supervision are not included; such areas are listed under the classifications "Land utilization projects" and "Other areas".

Purchase units.---Areas established by the Secretary of Agriculture with the concurrence of the National Forest Reservation Commission but not formalized by legislative or executive action. Acreages shown as national forest land, and other land administered by the Forest Service include all administrative sites outside the established boundaries and those portions of the land utilization projects and other areas over which the Forest Service has supervision located within the established purchase unit boundaries. Land utilization and other areas located outside the boundaries and under Forest Service supervision are not included; such areas are listed under the classification "Land utilization projects" and "Other areas".

Experimental areas.---Areas outside of the exterior boundaries of national forests or purchase units which have been reserved and dedicated to forest or range research and experimentation by legislative or executive action. The Massabesic Experimental Forest in Maine and the McNeill Division of the Harrison Experimental Forest in Mississippi, which have both purchase unit and experimental area status, are included only in the experimental area summaries. The Standing Stone project in Pennsylvania, Eastern Shore area in Maryland and Lee area in Virginia are land utilization lands having experimental forest status. They are reported as Land utilization projects.

Land utilization projects.---Lands outside the national forests and purchase units that are administered by the Forest Service in pursuance of certain national programs of land utilization and adjustment. Includes the Standing Stone, Eastern Shore and Lee projects that are also dedicated as experimental areas. Does not include land utilization project lands that are managed by the States or State agencies under lease or cooperative license agreement.

Other areas.---Lands administered by the Forest Service that are not included in the above designated groups.

- 2/ Does not include lands within certain state forests in Michigan which have been acquired by the United States with intent to exchange them for state lands within the national forests.
- 2/ Exclusive of the area at the Beltsville Research Center of the Department of Agriculture that is used by the Forest Service as an experimental area.
- 4/ Includes national forest lands under the primary jurisdiction of other federal agencies where the national forest withdrawal has not been revoked.
- 5/ Lands within the unit boundaries in private, state, county, and municipal, etc., ownership, and federal lands over which the Forest Service has no jurisdiction.




