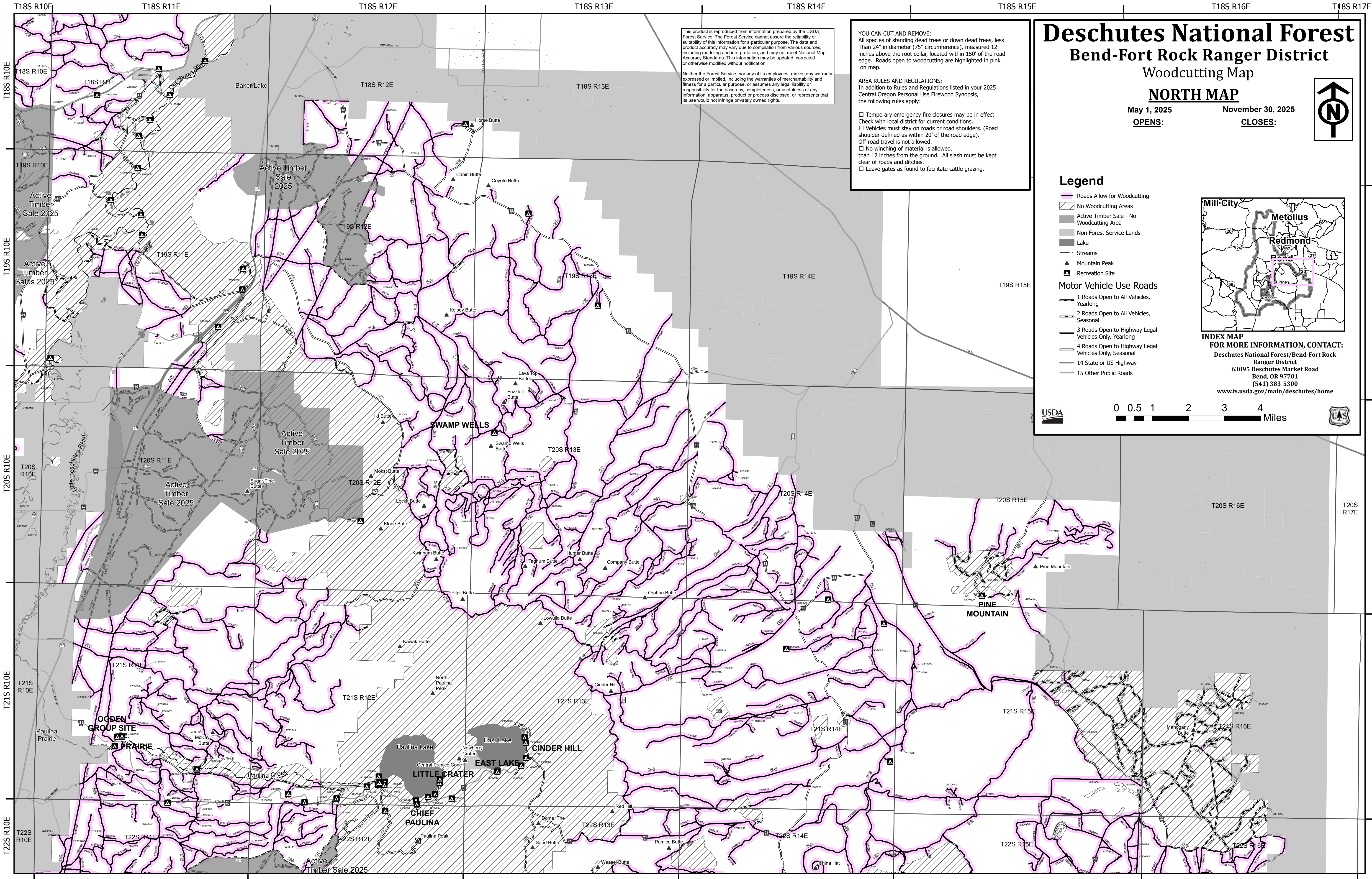

YOU CAN CUT AND REMOVE:
All species of standing dead trees or down dead trees, less Than 24" in diameter (75" circumference), measured 12 inches above the root collar, located within 150' of the road edge. Roads open to woodcutting are highlighted in pink on map.

AREA RULES AND REGULATIONS:
In addition to Rules and Regulations listed in your 2025 Central Oregon Personal Use Firewood Synopsis, the following rules apply:

- Temporary emergency fire closures may be in effect. Check with local district for current conditions.
- Vehicles must stay on roads or road shoulders. (Road shoulder defined as within 20' of the road edge). Off-road travel is not allowed.
- No winching of material is allowed.
- than 12 inches from the ground. All slash must be kept clear of roads and ditches.
- Leave gates as found to facilitate cattle grazing.

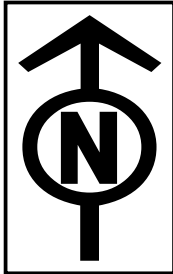

Woodcutting Map

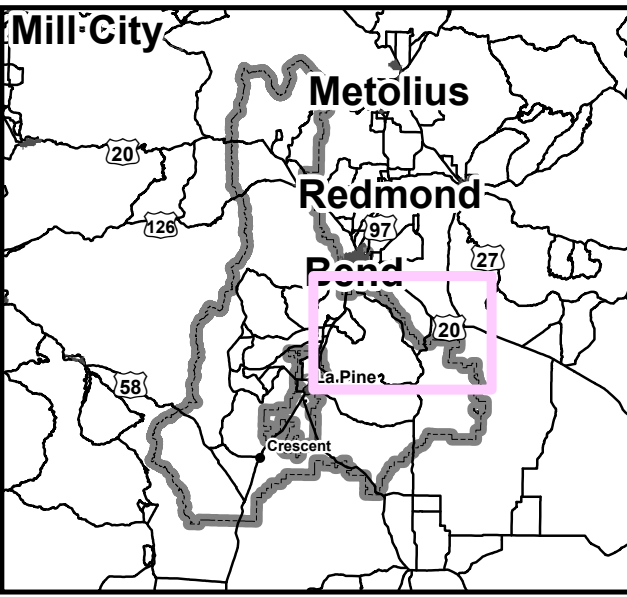

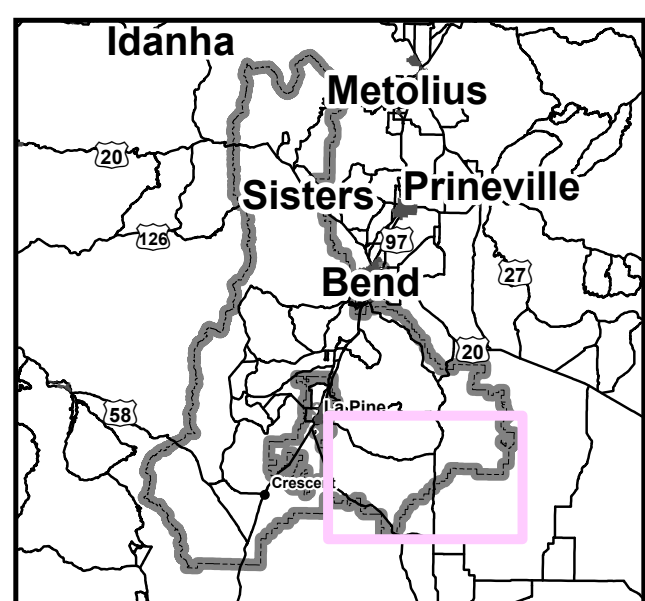
