## Getting Here:

From Lenoir: Take U.S. 90 west to Colettesville; turn left on SR 1337, Adako Road, just beyond elementary school and grocery store. Travel about 4.5 miles to FR 299, the entrance to the off-highway vehicle area. Turn right and travel 1.25 miles to the trailhead. From Morganton: Take NC 181 to SR 1405, Brown Mountain Beach Road. Turn right and travel about 3.75 miles to FR 299. Turn left and travel 1.25 miles to the trailhead.

Signs are located at the head of each trail section. A detailed map of the area is available for purchase.

These trails are mostly designed for trail bikes and ATVs. Jeeps and 4WD vehicles may only use Trail 8 and part of Trail 1. No bushwhacking or cutting vegetation is allowed. Restrooms and picnic facilities are available at the trailhead.

*Be safe.* Help ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all visitors to the forest,

• Riders must have valid permits attached to their vehicles at all times. Daily and annual permits are available at several local vendors and at the Grandfather Ranger Station.

• Ride only on designated trails. Do not travel cross-country.

• OHVs are not allowed on forest roads

• Do not carelessly operate a vehicle without regard for another's safety or in a way that could endanger any person or property.

• Do not operate a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in Brown Mountain OHV area or in campsites.

• Children under age 8 may not operate ATVs or motorcycles. Children under age 16 must have constant

supervision of a person over 18 years of age.

- Don't double-ride your OHV.
- Don't operate a vehicle without a helmet.
- Don't operate a vehicle with metal studs embedded in the tire or protruding from the tires.
- Don't operate a vehicle in excess of the maximum noise limit allowed. The maximum is 99 dBu (taken stationary at 20 inches from the exhaust at a 45-degree angle).
